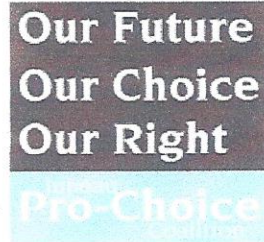

9. What, in your view, are the most appropriate public policies that the community, municipality, state and citizenry can enact to address the issues of teen pregnancy, Alaska's high rate of sexually transmitted infections, sexual assault and abuse, and reproductive health access for men and women?

Education and access to contraception are the most important ways to address teen pregnancy, STIs and reproductive health in general. Regarding sexual assault and abuse, we must both strengthen enforcement against these crimes while also expanding access to shelters for victims and families. Often the perceived lack of a safe place to go is one of the main reasons victims don't leave abusive situations.

10. Do you support comprehensive, medically-accurate sexual health education programs* in Alaskan schools?

Yes. Education is critical for reducing risky sexual behavior. We've conducted extensive research into what works and what doesn't. As Lt. Governor, I would listen to the experts about how best to educate our students.

***Sexual health education includes instruction on puberty, healthy sexuality, relationships, consent, pregnancy and STI prevention, reproduction and anatomy, and abstinence.**
