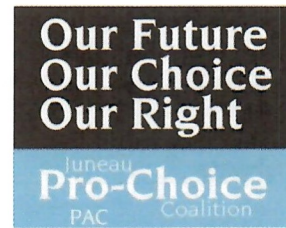

Comments Extremely important. As a biological female, I have accessed reproductive care throughout my childbearing years, including abortion, contraception, and pregnancy care.



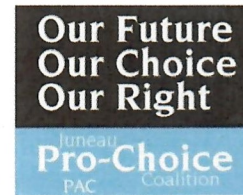

9. What, in your view, are the most appropriate public policies that the community, municipality, and citizenry can enact to address the issues of teen pregnancy, Alaska's high rate of sexually transmitted infections, sexual assault and abuse, and reproductive health access for men and women?

I believe that public health agencies should provide scientific, peer-reviewed, research-based information about reproductive health issues. Free or low-cost access to condoms, dental dams, testing, and other methods should be available to the public, including teens, to prevent sexually transmitted infections should be available to both men and women. Free access to birth control should be made available to all ages. Birth control should not always fall on women due to the consequences. I fully support the development and broad adoption of birth control for men. Abuse is often passed from one generation to another. We need to implement trauma engaged education and programs to address the trauma from sexual assault and abuse. Stiff penalties should be applied to those convicted of sexual assault and abuse.
